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WELCOME

Over the last two years we have come to know a lot about our capacity to change and adapt. This has been tested in a myriad of ways, across the globe we have seen people embracing the opportunity to move from the known to the unknown with great willingness and imagination.

Opera is an art form that is sometimes criticised for being resistant to change, not only the art form but the way it positions itself. It has been described as – inaccessible, unappealing to young people, and in recent years it has grappled with the roles women have traditionally been given on and off the stage.

At Opera Queensland we want to challenge this. Our 2022 season sets out to reposition opera as a vital part of the cultural conversation. Our business is innately involved in change and we continually look for new ideas to refresh the work we do. We do not want to deny the past but use it as an inspiration to imaginatively engage with complex conversations.

We open the year with *The Sopranos*, a new work by Sarah Holland-Batt that celebrates and explores the representation of women in opera. Drawing upon the music of composers from across history, Sarah brings her poet's sensitivity to this rich and complex subject, illuminating stories and characters so that we might see them afresh.

A new production of Verdi's *La Traviata* will follow, directed by Sarah Giles, whose sublime production of *Lorelei* wowed audiences in 2021. For all the wonderful chorus scenes in this opera it is, at heart, a chamber piece driven by finely nuanced dramatic writing. Kang Wang, José Carbó and Lorina Gore lead an ensemble of very fine singers who understand the multifaceted power of the voice to express drama. With Dane Lam leading the Queensland Symphony Orchestra, this promises to be a genuinely thrilling night out.

Our final main stage production is a double bill featuring virtuosic solo performances from two Australian sopranos: Poulenc's *The Human Voice* (*La Voix Humaine*) stars Alexandra Flood as the troubled Elle; *The Call* is a new work by Australian composer Connor D'Netto with Kate Miller-Heidke and Keir Nuttall, starring Ali McGregor. Written sixty years apart, these stories of women alone, looking to reconnect with a world that has left them behind, are profoundly compassionate works, revealing how key to the process of change is listening without prejudice.

Audiences have warmly embraced our Studio Series and, with the borders opening, we are spreading our wings and welcoming some of Australia's finest singers from around the country and the world. Their brief, as ever, is to share an hour of music that tells a story about their life in song.

We are thrilled to be returning to Longreach, Winton and surrounding shires with our Festival of Outback Opera, where the majesty of opera meets the wonder of vast horizons and dazzling night skies. With Arts


Queensland's support, we are extending the program with a greater variety of performances utilising the unique historical architecture of the region and creating more opportunities to meet the artists.

The continuing generosity of the Tim Fairfax Family Foundation ensures our learning, regional and community programs go from strength to strength. In 2022 we are expanding our regional program, working with artists in remote communities to develop new works that tell Queensland stories.

The support of our performing partners, QPAC, Queensland Symphony Orchestra and Camerata – Queensland's Chamber Orchestra, plays a vital role in our delivery of performances of the highest quality.
