
Opera Queensland's Festival of Outback Opera shines a spotlight on our iconic remote venues, and provides unique backdrops to stunning operatic performances.

A NOTE FROM DANE LAM







Music Director DANE LAM

Australian-Chinese conductor, Dane Lam, is Principal Conductor of the Xi'an Symphony Orchestra.
Operatically, he enjoys a close relationship with London's Opera Holland Park and companies including Opera Queensland, Opera Australia and Scottish Opera. He was recently appointed Resident Conductor and Associate Music Director of Opera Queensland.

Dane made his debut, aged eighteen, with the Sydney Symphony; recent engagements include Angela Hewitt, Stephen Hough, Ning Feng, Barry Douglas, and Kirill Gerstein with XSO; *La bohéme* and *Don Giovanni*

at Opera Australia, *L'arlesiana* and *Così fan tutte* for Opera Holland Park, *Giulio Cesare* for Bury Court Opera, *La clemenza di Tito* and *La rondine* for National Opera (Canberra), *Orfeo ed Euridice* and *Le nozze di Figaro* for Opera Queensland, *The Rake's Progress* and *La traviata* for Scottish Opera.

Dane Lam will conduct Opera Queensland's new production of *La traviata* in July. In 2023, he conducts *Carmen* in Perth; he also conducts the Xi'an, Hawai'i, Sydney, Melbourne, Queensland, Adelaide and West Australian Symphony Orchestras.



Concept and Co-writer PATRICK NOLAN

Currently the CEO & Artistic Director of Opera Queensland, Patrick Nolan has created productions for Opera Australia, WA Opera, Sydney Chamber Opera, New Zealand Opera, Seattle Opera, Sydney Theatre Company, Belvoir St, Griffin Theatre, Melbourne Theatre Company, London 2012 Cultural Olympiad, 2014 Glasgow Commonwealth Games and all the major Australian capital city festivals.

From 2009–2014 he was Artistic Director of Legs On The Wall, creating works that toured Australia, UK, Korea and Brazil. In 2015, Patrick was awarded

an Australia Council Fellowship to support research into large scale outdoor performance and the relationship between extreme physicality and storytelling.

Operas include: Oscar and Lucinda Opera Queensland with Sydney Chamber Opera and Victorian Opera; Tosca, A Flowering Tree and The Marriage of Figaro Opera Queensland; Verdi Requiem Opera Queensland with Bleach Festival; Katya Kabanova Seattle Opera and NZ Opera; Notes from Underground Sydney Chamber Opera; A Flowering Tree Perth Festival and WA Opera; Acis and Galatea, Dido and Aeneas, Il combattimento di Tancredi e Clorinda, Eugene Onegin, Pelléas et Mélisande Opera Australia; La bohème, Eugene Onegin New Zealand Opera; the world première of Love in the Age of Therapy by Paul Grabowsky and Joanna Murray-Smith for the Sydney and Melbourne Festivals.



SHAUN BROWN

Australian baritone Shaun Brown has performed and studied in England, Germany, France, Italy, and the United States of America, where he completed a Doctor of Musical Arts at the University of North Texas. A former Opera Queensland Young Artist, Shaun is known to Queensland audiences for his many appearances including roles in *Don Giovanni, The Merry Widow, Carmen, Le nozze di Figaro* and the Brisbane and touring productions of *La Bohème, Il barbiere di Siviglia* and *Ruddigore, or The Witch's Curse!*

Internationally, Shaun has sung for Opéra de Lyon, at the New Zealand International Arts Festival, Freiburg Opera, The Atelier du Rhin, and has performed in New York at the Center for Contemporary Opera in operatic works by Jake Heggie. He has performed to critical acclaim as a concert soloist, covering repertoire including Britten's War Requiem, Bach's St Matthew Passion, Handel's Messiah and Mendelssohn's Elijah. Currently, Shaun is Director of Performance at The University of Queensland School of Music, and is in high demand as an adjudicator for vocal and choral competitions across Queensland. Shaun will perform the role of Barone Douphol in Opera Queensland's new production of La traviata in July.



MARCUS COROWA

Marcus Corowa has captured the hearts of Australians with his silky, soulful voice and charming stage presence. An award-winning First Nations entertainer, Marcus is an accomplished singer/songwriter, actor and mentor. His credits include: Opera Queensland: Are you Lonesome Tonight; Opera Australia: Bran Nue Dae, The Rabbits; Sydney Theatre Company: The Secret River; Belvoir: Barbara and the Camp Dogs; Michael Cassel Group: Beautiful - The Carole King Musical; The Little Red Company: Your Song; Short Black Opera: Pecan Summer; Queensland Music Festival: Behind the Cane; Big Mama Productions: Song for the Mardoorwarra.

Drawing on his Aboriginal and South Sea Islander heritage, Marcus creates captivating music with elements of blues, jazz and funk; a combination that won him the Most Promising New Talent in Music award at the 2012 Deadly Awards and that can be heard on his EPs *Water & Air* and *The Greater You*. Marcus studied a Diploma of Music at EORA TAFE and is a positive role model and advocate for diversity and inclusion, committed to using his voice to mentor and inspire young Australians.



EVA KONG

In 2019, soprano Eva Kong sang the title role in Opera Australia's touring production of *Madama Butterfly* and made her début as Violetta (*La traviata*) in Seoul, South Korea; she also appeared as soprano soloist in *Iris dévoilée* for Sydney Symphony Orchestra and sang Kumudha in *A Flowering Tree* for Opera Queensland. Her 2020/2021 engagements included the title role in *Manon* for Korean National Opera and the Countess in *The Marriage of Figaro* for Opera Queensland.

In 2017/2018, she sang La Charmeuse in *Thaïs,* took the soprano solos in *Carmina Burana* for the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra and sang Donna Anna (*Don Giovanni*)

for Opera Queensland.

Her performance as Laura in *Luisa Miller* for Opera Australia earned her a Green Room Award. For the national company, she has also sung Donna Anna in *Don Giovanni* and Liù in *Turandot*.

Eva received a Helpmann Award Nomination and was a Green Room Award Winner for her commanding appearance as Madame Mao in *Nixon in China* for Victorian Opera.



EMMA NIGHTINGALE

Emma Nightingale is an emerging lyric soprano from Brisbane, Australia. In 2019 she was selected as a Young Artist for the Pacific Opera program in Sydney, with concert credits including soloist in *A Viennese Gala* with the Willoughby Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Dr Nicholas Milton AM.

Emma played Gretel in Opera Queensland's schools touring production *Hansel and Gretel* (2019) in collaboration with shake & stir theatre co., as well as appearing in the Opera Queensland chorus for *Ruddigore* (2017), *Peter Grimes* (2018), *Don Giovanni* (2018) and *A Flowering Tree* (2019).

In early 2020, Emma began the year performing the Foreign Woman in Menotti's *The Consul*, as part of the flagship production of the for-purpose opera start-up – The CoOperaTive – in Sydney. She is also a core member for internationally acclaimed classical crossover group, The Seven Sopranos, and has appeared with them for Bleach* on the Gold Coast, Brisbane Lord Mayor's Christmas Carols, Opera in the Gardens, and in concert with The Brisbane City Pops Orchestra. During her time in isolation in 2020, she performed online – as part of Opera Queensland's An Aria A Day initiative.

In 2021, Emma returned to school stages in the brand-new primary school jukebox opera *The Frog Prince* with Opera Queensland and shake & stir theatre co., as well as in *La bohème* for secondary students.



HAYLEY SUGARS

Hayley Sugars was a member of the Opera Queensland Young and Developing Artist Program (2007-2009) and has enjoyed success in many national competitions, including winning the German-Australian Opera Grant in 2010. This success resulted in contracts with the Hessisches Staatstheater Wiesbaden and the Landestheater Coburg.

Operatic repertoire includes Donna Elvira in Don Giovanni, the title role in Rinaldo, Mrs Grose in Turn of the Screw, Rosina in Il barbiere di Siviglia, Varvara in Katja Kabanova, Flora Bervoix in La traviata, Mirabella in Der Zigeunerbaron, Suzuki in Madama Butterfly, Cherubino in Le nozze di Figaro, Dido in Dido and Aeneas, Valencienne in Merry Widow, Prince Orlovsky in Die Fledermaus, Brangäne

in Tristan und Isolde, Auntie in Peter Grimes and Marcellina in Le nozze di Figaro.

Since returning to Australia, Hayley has performed to great acclaim for Opera Queensland, New Zealand Opera and Brisbane Festival. Most recently, she has performed Mahler's Symphony No. 2 and Handel's Messiah, as well as being featured as a soloist in Opera Queensland's 2021 Verdi Gala and The Sopranos in QPAC's Concert Hall. In July she performs the role of Flora in Opera Queensland's new production of La traviata.



ASHLYN TYMMS


Ashlyn Tymms most recently performed with the West Australian Opera as Dorabella in the Glyndebourne Festival production of Così fan tutte. In 2020, she also sang Hansel in the WAO production of Hansel and Gretel. Making her debut with the company as Lapák and Mrs Pásková in The Cunning Little Vixen, Ashlyn has also sung Flora in La traviata and Lady-in-Waiting in Verdi's Macbeth - as well as singing regionally with the company in The Pinnacles, the Valley of the Giants and Opera in the Quarry.

Ashlyn graduated as a HF Music Scholar at the Royal College of Music, London (Masters of Vocal Performance with Distinction) and has been awarded the Outstanding Australian Musician Award by the Royal Over-Seas League,

London. She sang Rosimonda in Handel's *Faramondo* at the London Handel Festival. Other roles include Judith in the world premiere of *The Two Sisters* with Tête à Tête Opera, La marchande de journaux in Poulenc's *Les mamelles de Tirésias*, Euridice in Monteverdi's *L'Orfeo*, the title role in *Dido and Aeneas*, Eurydice in Offenbach's *Orpheus in the Underworld* and Berenice in Rossini's *L'occasione fa il ladro*.

Ashlyn has performed extensively within Australia, UK and Asia on the concert platform. Major appearances have included Vaughan Williams' *Serenade to Music* at Buckingham Palace (hosted by The Prince of Wales), a tour to South Korea in recital with the London Cello Orchestra and Verdi's *Requiem* at the Sydney Town Hall.

2021-2022 engagements include the title role in *Carmen* and Santuzza in *Cavalleria* rusticana for West Australian Opera; she also appears as soloist with the West Australian Symphony Orchestra, Sydney Philharmonia and the Vienna Pops Orchestra.



KANG WANG

Australian-Chinese tenor Kang Wang is one of the most sought-after young lyric tenors in the opera world. He is a former member of the Lindemann Young Artist Development Program of the Metropolitan Opera and was a finalist in the 2017 Cardiff Singer of the World competition.

This season, Kang makes his house and role debut at Washington National Opera as Ferrando in *Così fan tutte*. He also makes his house debut at Seattle Opera as Rodolfo in *La bohème* and returned to Opera Australia in the same role. In concert, he joined the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra for a performance celebrating the Chinese New Year.

Highlights of recent sesasons include house debuts at Opera Australia as Alfredo and at Pittsburgh Opera as Don Ottavio in *Don Giovanni*, as well as performances of Tan Dun's *Buddha Passion* with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by Gustavo Dudamel. Kang makes his Opera Queensland main stage debut in the role of Alfredo in a new production of *La traviata*.





Director & Co-writer LAURA HANSFORD

Laura Hansford has worked on Opera Queensland productions for the last decade as both an artistic and technical collaborator. Most recently, Laura directed OQ's touring production *Are You Lonesome Tonight*, and was Associate Director on Circa's *Italian Baroque* presented with the Australian Brandenburg Orchestra at Sydney Festival 2022.

In 2021/2022 Laura was a resident Director with Circa and was the Project Lead on their inclusive Circus program Circability. Laura has acted as Assistant Director on a variety of productions – for Opera

Queensland: The Marriage of Figaro (2021), Tosca (2019), Songs to Die For (2019); and for Victorian Opera: The Barber of Seville (2019), Pelléas and Mélisande (2018).

Laura has worked extensively with companies such as Opera Australia, Victorian Opera, Queensland Symphony Orchestra, New Zealand Opera and State Opera South Australia. In 2020 Laura was nominated as an Emerging Female Artist at the Matilda awards.




Concept Designer MARG HORWELL

Marg's awards include 2005, 2007, 2009, 2013, 2015, 2016 and 2019 Green Room Awards, and 2013 Sydney Theatre Awards.



Musical Director and Singer JASON BARRY-SMITH

Jason Barry-Smith's study in Brisbane, Munich,
London and Rome led him to a singing career on the
Australian and New Zealand concert, music theatre, and
operatic stage. With almost 40 roles in his repertoire,
he's performed in some of Opera Queensland's most
successful productions since 1995, and he's also
performed for the Brisbane Biennial, Brisbane Cabaret
Festival, Opera Australia (Opera on the Beach), the Tokyo
Arts Foundation, the State Opera South Australia, New
Zealand Arts Festival, and New Zealand Opera.

Jason also created the roles of Aldo in *Mimma – A Musical of War & Friendship*, Samuel in *Electric Lenin* for NORPA and Julian in *Quartet* for the New Zealand Arts Festival. He's also a well known singing teacher, musical director, arranger, and director who specialises in regional community based arts projects.



Piano KYLIE LOS

Kylie Los graduated in 2002 from the Queensland University of Technology with a Bachelor of Music (Distinction), studying piano under Mark Gibson. She was later a member of Opera Queensland's Young and Developing Artist Programs (2006 – 2009, Repetiteur) and assisted with the musical preparation for many productions.

In 2010 Kylie undertook overseas training, studying in Germany with Michael Clark before commencing a Master of Music (Repetiteur) at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama, London, where she studied with Laura

Roberts. She was subsequently a Guildhall Artists Fellow, studying and working in London from 2011 – 2013. In 2013 Kylie was assistant conductor and chorus master for the Guildhall School's production of *Le nozze di Figaro*. She was repetiteur for Grange Park Opera's production *Les Carmélites* and played orchestral keyboard in performances with the English Chamber Orchestra. In 2014, Kylie returned to London as principal repetiteur for Grange Park Opera's *La traviata*.

Since returning to Australia, Kylie has worked extensively as a pianist, piano teacher and choral conductor. She has worked with Opera Queensland, Queensland Conservatorium Singers and the Gondwana National Choral School (2020). Kylie has had a strong involvement with Opera Queensland's Learning, Regional and Community programs and is delighted to be touring with Opera Queensland's *The Sopranos*.



AMBER EVANS

Amber Evans is an Australian vocalist, conductor and composer. She regularly performs as an early music soloist, chamber ensemble vocalist, and contemporary opera/vocal specialist, with consistent touring engagements in Australia, the US and the UK.

Winner of the inaugural US Dwight and Ursula Mamlok Advancement Award for the interpretation of contemporary music, she is committed to the vital artistic collaboration with composers to thoughtfully contribute to the musical canon of the present day. An exponent of the capabilities of the "extra-normal" voice, Ms Evans has premiered over fifty specialised vocal works, engaging

audiences with ever-changing insights into the paramount role of the voice in the evolution of art-making.




















