Director's Note

Once upon a time, when I was merely a six-year-old musical enthusiast, I didn't know the meaning of the word genre. Squashed alongside my brothers into the back seat of the Nissan Pulsar, my Dad either had the radio tuned to ABC 612 Classical, or my Mother was DJ'ing her way through our CD collection, from Crowded House and Herman's Hermits to the Very Best of Shania Twain. At the time I didn't know any better, but today Spotify would call this an eclectic playlist. Back then, I just knew I loved it when Mum and Dad let us turn the volume up loud.

Creating Are You Lonesome Tonight handed us all the opportunity for a childhood moment, to forget the word 'genre' and all the rules about music we have learned as grown-ups. A moment to turn to each other, to our brothers and sisters, and say; 'Hey what music do you like? Okay, let's give that a listen and let's turn it up loud.'

Letting go of the rules and immersing ourselves in the worlds of Opera and Country music we found they shared more common ground than we could've imagined. Shared histories, pivotal figures, vocal techniques and the sublime art of storytelling, as we dug into the music, we unearthed more and more connections. Two beloved art forms each so unique and yet each surprisingly similar, how do you begin to do them justice?

In the end we decided the best thing to do was to do what Country or Opera do best: To just tell their stories.

How did country come to be? Who helped Opera grow up? Where do their roads cross? And why does the music break our hearts over and over again? These are the questions we are looking to answer.

Country musician Harlan Howard once said 'All you need to write a country song is three chords and the truth". The Are You Lonesome Tonight family band; Marcus, Irena, Jonathan, Steve, Dane, Sara and Penny have dedicated themselves to speaking and singing authentically, to finding the truthful moments of Country and Opera and laying them out simply for us all to enjoy. As multidisciplinary artists they each in their own way epitomize the soul of this show; you don't have to follow the grown-ups rules, you can make and enjoy music however you like.

As a far-north Queensland gal myself I could not be more excited to have been a small part of the big story that is *Are You Lonesome Tonight*, to travel across the state with the story of Opera and Country, the strum of a guitar, the echo of a piano, a little bit of twang and a whole lot of heart.

Where Country and Opera Meet

When Sara Storer took the stage at Winton's Way Out West Festival this April it was her first gig in fifteen months

"Yeah, it's been a while," said Storer.

The Golden Guitar and ARIA award winning country music star may not have been playing gigs during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic but she was still busy, most recently on an innovative creative partnership with Opera Queensland.

Working closely with conductor Dane Lam and director Laura Hansford, Storer developed *Are You Lonesome Tonight*, a celebration of Opera and Country music set to tour regional Queensland in 2021, including Winton.

"It was a wonderful time working with [Opera Queensland] on finding songs that connected between opera and country music," Storer said.

The storytelling strengths of both genres shone through.

"I could say, hey, these are some of the major country classics that we've had over the decades that everyone knows, and the story is this," Storer said.

"And of course, [Opera Queensland] would say, well here's our stories and our songs, hey, those two really connect."

For the production's Musical Consultant for Opera Dane Lam the immersion in country music expanded his thinking of both art forms.

Lam was fascinated to explore the ways in which Country music has become synonymous with the Australian bush and stories of the land.

"There's an excerpt from Kate Miller Heidke's opera, The Rabbits, which uses native Australian animals juxtaposed with these invading rabbits as a way to illustrate invasion and colonisation," said Lam.

"And we put that up against certain Indigenous country music and these stories go around each other. And they're both telling the same story in different ways and in different styles. I think that's quite a powerful thing to see how two distinct musical forms deal with the same issue."

Are You Lonesome Tonight reflects Opera
Queensland's commitment to regional Queensland.
The pandemic has only sharpened that mission.

"This last 12 months... it's been wonderful to be part of a company like Opera Queensland that does have this local mindset, that presents the art of song and the art of opera in a way that we hope speaks to many people across a wide cross section of our state," said

Storer thinks the magic for audiences is in hearing two genres come together as one.

"You know, regional Queensland will be familiar with country music. But to bring the opera into it, it's going to be really special."

"Once they start singing, they blow you away because opera singers have just the most amazing, beautiful voices," Storer said.

"I know, myself, as a bit of a bushie and a country music singer, I can't help but be besotted."

40 years of Opera in Regional Queensland

Being the state opera company for Australia's most decentralised state, regional touring in Queensland proves to be a challenging but rewarding element of Opera Queensland's annual offering. We have proudly toured traditional operas and new productions every year in our 40 years history. Over the course of those 40 years while our commitment to touring quality works hasn't changed, the model of delivery and the way we engage with audiences has continued to evolve.

Over the next two months, our new production, *Are You Lonesome Tonight*, will travel more than 7,000 kms on its two month journey around Queensland. The cast and crew will travel in two Toyota LandCruisers and an 8-tonne truck with full set and costumes. This is a stark contrast to our regional touring in the early 80's, when our journey was made by train, travelling only to communities the Queensland Rail network reached, with a carriage hitched to a train to transport our shows across the state, predominantly sticking to coastal communities.

Our 40th anniversary tour is Opera Queensland's most extensive tour to date, performing in 30 locations across Queensland. Each location is as unique as the next, celebrating the diverse landscapes of our state from the Great Barrier Reef to the Outback and everything in between. In addition to performing in traditional theatres, the production embraces the landscape and community hubs as possible stages; performing in settings that include a cattle selling arena, rodeo grounds, a football stadium, museums, showgrounds and race tracks.

It's not just how we travel and where we perform that has evolved. Particularly in the last ten years, how we engage with Queenslanders of all ages and from all walks of life has changed through our Learning, Regional and Community programs. In 2020, our engagement activities include a 70-piece community chorus for the world premiere of *Are You Lonesome Tonight* in Rockhampton, school and community workshops, pop-up performances at aged care centres and professional development opportunities for arts workers.

The Are You Lonesome Tonight regional tour has been made possible thanks to the generous support of our government partners and corporate sponsors. Our principal partner, Beef Australia understood the opportunity in premiering this new work in Rockhampton and supporting the state-wide tour. We are also grateful to The Southport School, who are supporting this tour to connect with regional families across the state. Opera Queensland will continue to collaborate with partners across Queensland to deliver vibrant and virtuosic works. We look forward to another 40 years of growing community through the transformative power of opera.

at Opera Queensland in 2012, she has been instrumental in many of the company's most memorable works, most recently as Assistant Director for the company's 2019 production of Tosca. Recently Laura has worked as an Associate Director for Victorian Opera on productions of Pelléas et Mélisande and The Barber of Seville. Laura has worked with companies such as Opera Australia, the State of South Australia, New Zealand Opera, Circa and the Queensland Symphony Orchestra, but her true passion lies in her engagements with Opera Queensland's and the Learning, Regional and Community Department, where she was a part of the last six regional touring programs. In 2020 Laura was nominated as an Emerging Female Artist at the Matilda awards.

Long regarded as one of Australia's finest jazz pianists and accompanists and a highly accomplished composer and arranger, Steve Russell has appeared with a vast array of national and international jazz,

blues, pop and cabaret artists in an eclectic career spanning some forty years. His performance credits include Rodriguez, Chrissy Amphlett, Dan Sultan, Wendy Matthews, William Barton, Katie Noonan, James Morrison, Troy Cassar-Daley, Kate Miller-Heidke and Shellie Morris.

Steve is also a passionate educator, currently teaching at the Jazz Music Institute and Southern Cross University.

Previous musical directorships include the Queensland Performing Arts Centre's Songs of Justice, Queensland Music Festival productions, the Mount Isa Blast, the Yarrabah Band Festival and The Isaac Project, as well as *Snow White*, Opera Queensland's co-production with La Boîte Theatre, and five seasons of the iconic Women in Voice.



DANE LAMMusic Consultant

Australian-Chinese conductor Dane Lam is Principal Conductor of the Xi'an Symphony Orchestra and Opera Queensland's 2021 Resident Conductor and Associate Music Director. Operatically, he enjoys a

close relationship with London's Opera Holland Park, Opera Australia and Scottish Opera.

Dane made his debut, aged eighteen, with the Sydney Symphony and has since conducted: the Queensland, Adelaide, Canberra, Dunedin, Kunming, Shandong and Suzhou Symphony Orchestras, Münchner Rundfunkorchester, Het Residentie Orkest, City of London Sinfonia, Manchester Camerata, South Bank Sinfonia, Liverpool Philharmonic Ensemble 10/10, RTÉ Concert Orchestra, Beethoven Orchester Bonn, Verbier Festival Orchestra and the Juilliard Orchestra.

Recent engagements include concerts with Angela Hewitt, Stephen Hough, Ning Feng, Barry Douglas and Kirill Gerstein with XSO; La bohéme and Don Giovanni at Opera Australia; L'arlesiana and Così fan tutte for Opera Holland Park; Giulio Cesare for Bury Court Opera; Orfeo ed Euridice for Opera Queensland; and The Rake's Progress and La traviata for Scottish Opera.

In 2021, Dane Lam will lead seasons of *Le nozze di Figaro* in Brisbane and *La clemenza di Tito* in Canberra, and will conduct the Xi'an Symphony (with Martha Argerich as soloist) and the Sydney, Melbourne, Queensland and Adelaide Symphony Orchestras.



SARA STORERMusic Consultant Country

Sara Storer is a renowned Australian country music singer-songwriter and former teacher. She won a record breaking seven Golden Guitar awards in the Tamworth Country Music Festival in January 2004, and as of 2017, she has won 21 in total.

Three of her six studio albums have reached the top 30 on the ARIA Albums Chart, Firefly (July 2005), Lovegrass (August 2013) and Silos (March 2016). Silos also won Best Country Album at the ARIA Music Awards of 2016. Storer has been a member of a country music trio, Songbirds (2007–09) alongside Beccy Cole and Gina Jeffries.

IRENA LYSIUK

Singer 1

Since graduating from Queensland Conservatorium, Griffith University in 2016 with a Graduate Diploma in Music Studies and in 2014 with a Bachelor of Music, Irena Lysiuk has worked extensively for Opera Queensland.

Irena played the role of Gretel in Opera Queensland and shake & stir theatre co's school touring production of Hansel and Gretel (2017–18) and Adina in FiZZ! (2016), as well as chorus roles in Opera Queensland productions including Gilbert & Sullivan's Ruddigore (2017), Don Giovanni (2018) and A Flowering Tree (2019).

Turning to musical theatre, Irena played Carmen in Sweet Charity at the Brisbane Powerhouse (2019) and Anne Egerman in the Brisbane Philharmonic Orchestra's production of Sondheim's A Little Night Music (2018). In 2018, Irena debuted the role of the Pussycat in Little Match Productions' new opera The Owl & the Pussycat, and performed at CommGames Festival and Brisbane Festival 2018 at QPAC. During her time at the university, Irena's roles included Damigella in L'incoronazione di Poppea (2015), Barbarina in Le nozze di Figaro (2013), Papagena in Die Zauberflöte — scenes (2012), and Una Novizia in Suor Angelica (2011).





MARCUS COROWA

Singer 2

Marcus Corowa has captured the hearts of Australians with his silky, soulful voice and charming stage presence. An awardwinning First Nations entertainer, Marcus is an accomplished singer/songwriter, composer, actor and mentor who has been turning heads for more than a decade.

Drawing on his Aboriginal and South Sea Islander heritage, Marcus creates captivating music with elements of blues, jazz and funk; a combination that won him the 'Most Promising New Talent in Music' award at the 2012 Deadly Awards and that can be heard on his EPs Water & Air and The Greater You. Since then, Marcus has found success as an independent recording artist, composer and actor.

Marcus is an exceptional live entertainer which has resulted in amazing partnerships. He was part of the 30-year anniversary celebrations for Australian Catholic University's Indigenous program, Yalbinga, performed with the Australian Brandenburg Orchestra at The National Centre for Indigenous Excellence Reconciliation Action Week, and has secured residencies with both Voyages Sails in the Desert and on the Indian Pacific. He is a positive role model and advocate for diversity and inclusion, committed to using his voice to mentor and inspire young Australians.

JONATHAN HICKEY

Singer 3

Jonathan Hickey is a musical theatre performer and multi-instrumentalist. He most recently played Tobias in TEG's 40th anniversary production of *Sweeney Todd*, performing at the Darling Harbour Theatre, ICC Sydney and Her Majesty's Theatre, Melbourne.

Other notable roles are Alex in Aspects of Love (Hayes Theatre, Sydney), Fabrizio in The Light in the Piazza (Melbourne Arts Centre), for which he was nominated for a Green Room Award for best supporting actor, and Matt in The Fantasticks (Hayes Theatre, Sydney).

Jonathan has toured regional Queensland as part of Opera Queensland's Open Stage school touring program in FiZZ! (2015, 2016) and Hansel & Gretel (2018). Other theatre credits include Opera Queensland's The Pearlfishers, Matt in Bare, Henrik in A Little Night Music with Brisbane Philharmonic. He also enjoys composing and performing in his family band Chinatown Carpark.


